1.1 INTRODUCTION

Named after the esteemed late Prof. S. Nurul Hasan, a historian and scholar, the college was inaugurated by the late Governor K.V. Raghunath Reddy, under the visionary leadership of ex-M.L.A. Abul Hasnat Khan. From its inception with two dedicated lecturers and a few students, it has grown into a vibrant academic community serving nearly four thousand students today.

Current principal Dr. Capt. Sibasish Banerjee fosters a culture of innovation and inclusivity. Under his leadership, the college offers nine major courses and eleven minor courses, catering to diverse student interests. Modern infrastructure enhances the learning experience, including a digital library, a well-equipped gymnasium, and a spacious stadium for sports and extracurricular activities.

The college campus promotes holistic development, with two well-maintained hostels providing safe and supportive living environments for OBC boys and female students, fostering inclusivity. The physical infrastructure comprises two buildings: the old building, reflecting the college's legacy, and the modern science building.

Affiliated with the University of Kalyani, the college upholds high academic standards and supports many first-generation learners, symbolizing resilience and ambition. - 2. There is a need for greater investment in modern teaching-learning technologies and ICT resources to align with current educational standards.
- 3. The rapid growth in student enrollment necessitates additional classrooms and facilities, placing pressure on existing infrastructure.
- 4. Shortages in both teaching and non-teaching staff persist, with slow government recruitment processes hindering the establishment of essential positions.
- 5. Many students face financial difficulties, exacerbated by low parental education and awareness, which discourages their pursuit of higher education, particularly for first-generation learners.
- 6. Insufficient faculty positions lead to increased workloads, limiting teachers' ability to engage in research and impacting overall academic output.
- 7. There is a need to improve student performance on national-level exams like NET/SET and other competitive assessments to enhance employment prospects.
- 8. Strengthening alumni participation is essential to bolster the college's resources and networks.
- 9. The absence of nearby industries and low engagement from existing businesses hampers the development of strong industry-institution partnerships.
- 10. More interdisciplinary research collaborations with other institutions and industries are crucial for supporting institutional growth.
- 11. Limited interest from reputable organizations in providing on-campus consultative and placement opportunities restricts students' employment prospects.
- 12. Language barriers among many students diminish their employability, particularly in competitive job markets.
- 13. Increased funding is necessary to improve infrastructure and address resource shortages critical for institutional development.

Curricular Aspects

Affiliated with the University of Kalyani, Prof. S. Nurul Hasan College is committed to providing a holistic education that fosters responsible citizenship, advanced knowledge, and strong ethical values. Our faculty play a crucial role in curriculum development through active participation in the Board of Studies, ensuring their insights are integrated into our academic framework. The Academic Calendar, developed by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) with institutional input, outlines key dates for sessions, examinations,

holidays, and events, and is accessible on the college website. We adhere to this calendar, making deviations only in exceptional circumstances, such as during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Each semester begins with departmental meetings to create lesson plans, which are shared with students to promote transparency and accountability. The Routine Committee prepares a Master Routine that aligns with departmental priorities, ensuring a structured academic schedule. Timely syllabus completion is closely monitored through these plans.

Recent enhancements include a Learning Management System (LMS) that provides digital access to teaching materials, supported by ICT tools and practical classes. We also offer tutorial and mentoring sessions to effectively assist all learners. The College Library is equipped with extensive resources, including e-books, journals, and IT facilities.

Continuous evaluation is integrated into our teaching process through class tests, assignments, and student seminars. The Annual Test Examination prepares students for university exams, with results posted on departmental notice boards. Professional ethics are incorporated into various disciplines, equipping students with essential ethical insights.

We address gender issues through courses in Philosophy, Political Science, English, and other subjects, supplemented by events organized by the Internal Complaints Committee and the National Service Scheme (NSS). Environmental consciousness is promoted through a mandatory Environmental Studies course and initiatives such as cleanliness drives and tree planting. Additionally, the college offers certificate and value-added courses, as well as online options through platforms like MOOCs, SWAYAM, and NPTEL, ensuring continuous improvement through collected feedback.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

For slower learners, regular mentoring and remedial classes are offered, along with tailored preparation for competitive exams. Parent-teacher meetings facilitate discussions on academic progress. The incorporation of ICT tools enriches the learning experience, with departments organizing field trips, such as geomorphic excursions, and maintaining facilities like a medicinal plant garden. Digital resources are utilized for teaching, project work, and presentations, while the curriculum has adapted post-pandemic to include internships, apprenticeships, and resources for drama, language courses, and political science activities.

The college clearly outlines Program Outcomes (POs) and Course Outcomes (COs) through syllabi and academic calendars. Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) methods, including seminars and class tests, complement semester exams. Nurul Hasan College, with the National Service Scheme (NSS) providing students opportunities to develop democratic values and participate in community service. Activities such as blood donation drives, COVID-19 relief efforts, environmental conservation initiatives, and educational seminars underscore the college's commitment to social responsibility. Infrastructure and Learning Resources

Prof. S. Nurul Hasan College, established on October 3, 1994, spans an 11-acre campus and offers nine undergraduate programs in the Arts, Science & Vocational. The college is dedicated to enhancing its infrastructure, human resources, and learning resources, featuring well-ventilated classrooms, advanced laboratories, and two high-tech conference rooms. A key asset is the library, which houses 12,525 books and over 6,000 online journals, supported by digital resources from N-LIST and Sage Publications.

Additional facilities include extensive computing resources, comprehensive Wi-Fi, fire safety measures, and eco-friendly features such as solar panels and a backup generator. The college prioritizes sustainability through initiatives like rainwater harvesting, waste management, and air quality monitoring systems. Accessibility for differently-abled individuals is a focus, alongside health services that include a gymnasium and yoga center, as

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well as unique offerings like an Oral Archive and a Medicinal Plant Garden.

The library employs KOHA software, providing access to over 12,000 books, 6,000 e-journals, and 799,500 e-books, including special collections featuring works of Nobel Laureates. In the 2022-2023 period, investments in the library targeted subscriptions, new equipment, and automation enhancements, with plans to open it to the public to foster community engagement.

Technologically, the college maintains 228 computers with a robust Wi-Fi network offering 150 Mbps bandwidth. Seminar rooms are equipped for virtual classes, and specialized software supports various departments. The transition to a Learning Management System (LMS) has modernized educational delivery, while administrative functions are streamlined through software like ERP and a well-maintained website. The IT infrastructure is continuously updated, emphasizing cybersecurity and high standards of technological support.

Overall, Prof. S. Nurul Hasan College provides a dynamic educational environment characterized by advanced facilities, extensive resources, and a strong commitment to technological excellence and sustainability.

Student Support and Progression

Prof. S. Nurul Hasan College is committed to enhancing student capabilities and addressing grievances through comprehensive support systems. Currently, 85% students benefit from scholarships and freeships provided by the institution and government initiatives. The college organizes a variety of capacity-building activities, including training in soft skills, language and communication skills, life skills (such as yoga, physical fitness, health, and hygiene), and ICT/computing skills. Additionally, it offers guidance for competitive exams and career counseling to facilitate student progression.

In terms of grievance redressal, the college adheres to statutory guidelines and maintains a zero-tolerance policy towards sexual harassment and ragging. Students can submit grievances through both online and offline channels, with timely resolutions handled by dedicated committees. Over the past five years, the college has achieved significant placements and advancements in student progression to higher education, with students excelling in state, national, and international examinations, as well as securing many awards and medals in sports and cultural activities.

The Prof. S. Nurul Hasan College Alumni Association, now boasting over 500 active members, has evolved from its initial 20 life members. Led by Principal Dr. Capt. Sibasish Banerjee, the association includes faculty and non-teaching staff and has played a crucial role in supporting the college, particularly during the COVID-19 pandemic by contributing to campus maintenance. It also provides monetary awards to outstanding students and organizes successful alumni events that foster networking and community engagement. Alumni frequently deliver motivational speeches, guide current students, and participate in cultural and sports events, reinforcing the college's traditions and sense of community.

Governance, Leadership and Management

Prof. S. Nurul Hasan College excels in educational quality and global competence through strategic planning and enhancement driven by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC). The IQAC oversees the annual strategic plan, focusing on quality improvements through diverse events, infrastructure upgrades, and rigorous

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annual reviews, including research promotion and student vulnerability surveys. Financial decisions are assessed by the Finance Subcommittee and approved by the Governing Body.

The Career Counselling Cell enhances student employability by facilitating industry interactions and organizing training programs and workshops driven by corporate social responsibility (CSR). A robust auditing procedure is employed, comprising four layers: Internal Academic Audits conducted by Heads of Departments (HODs) and the IQAC, validated by the Principal; External Audits performed by members reviewed by Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) and the Director of the Malviya Mission Teacher Training Center; and Internal Administrative Audits managed by the Finance Subcommittee to ensure adherence to standards.

Governance and administration fall under the Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal, with the College Service Commission handling recruitment and appointments according to West Bengal Service Rules (WBSR) and UGC guidelines. The institutional structure is led by the Principal, supported by the IQAC, Teachers' Council, and College Office, with all permanent teachers included in the Teachers' Council, alongside contributions from HODs, the Head Assistant, and the Students' Union.

Strategic initiatives during the COVID-19 pandemic included fee waivers and a free studentship scheme for economically disadvantaged students. Staff welfare programs for non-teaching staff offer subsidized medical facilities, maternity leave, and financial support, while teaching staff benefit from financial assistance, ICT facilities, recreational amenities, and government benefits like pensions and travel concessions.

Financial management ensures transparency through internal audits by the Bursar and Finance Committee, complemented by external audits conducted by a government-recommended auditor. The IQAC has achieved significant milestones, including student enrichment through a Language Lab and add-on courses; upgrades to eresources; and quality assurance via regular audits and training programs. Additionally, faculty development, curriculum design contributions, mentoring, the implementation of a Learning Management System (LMS), and a Digital Archival Centre for preserving local heritage underscore the college's commitment to continuous improvement and high standards.

Institutional Values and Best Practices

The campus promotes a safe environment with CCTV surveillance and a dedicated Girls' Common Room, along with sanitary napkin vending machines to support menstrual health. Accessibility is a key focus, with facilities such as ramps, walkways, and toilets designed for differently-abled individuals. The institution fosters inclusivity through events aimed at SC/ST, OBC, minority groups, and women, celebrated on occasions like Communal Harmony Day and International Women's Day. A Code of Conduct for teaching and non-teaching staff ensures accountability and professionalism.

Additionally, several Humanities departments contribute to the curriculum with certificate courses and specialized programs focused on skill development and humanitarian growth. In alignment with the National Education Policy (NEP), the college has introduced vocational and professional training courses in areas such as Yoga and Self-Defense, highlighting their interdisciplinary nature. Our Career Counselling Cell conducts workshops and seminars to prepare students for the job market, while the NSS units foster a sense of social responsibility. We aim to integrate this multidisciplinary approach across all undergraduate programs, encompassing basic, professional, and vocational disciplines. We are particularly focused on expanding areas such as Languages, Literature, Philosophy, Arts, Cultural and Social Activities, ICT-based learning, Sociology, Sports, Translation, and Interpretation. These fields are essential for creating a holistic educational environment that promotes comprehensive student development. Furthermore, the college plans to leverage open and distance learning (ODL) modes to complement existing semester-based offerings. We are committed to facilitating practical learning experiences through internships with local industries and businesses, enhancing students' practical knowledge and employability, and effectively preparing them for their future careers.

2. Academic bank of credits (ABC):

Prof. S. Nurul Hasan College is embracing a blended

learning approach that enables students to earn credits from various accredited higher education institutions through platforms like SWAYAM and MOOCs. The college actively encourages both faculty and students to register for and engage with these national initiatives, enriching their academic and practical knowledge. While we await authorization from relevant authorities, we have initiated discussions with our affiliating university to incorporate the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) into our skill-oriented programs. Additionally, we have signed Memoranda of Understanding (MOUs) with several institutions and are exploring both traditional and online channels to maximize the benefits of the ABC for our students and those from other colleges within a unified system. Implementing the ABC at the degree level will require extensive collaboration among institutions and regulatory bodies. This initiative has the potential to transform credit transfers across universities and recognize credits earned through non-traditional courses. Prof. S. Nurul Hasan College has partnered with various academic and research institutes to offer a range of certificate programs and value-added courses that align with the core objectives of the ABC. The admission advisory from our affiliating university has emphasized the importance of introducing the ABC, highlighting its role in modernizing and enhancing the flexibility of higher education. To facilitate this, we have established our own digital locker system, actively preparing for the implementation of the ABC as outlined in the National Education Policy. This flexible academic structure will allow undergraduate students multiple entry and exit points during their courses, enabling them to balance education with employment opportunities and potentially reducing dropout rates. Under the ABC scheme, students can exit a program after achieving any qualification level and later return to complete their studies within a specified timeframe. We are already gathering essential details from students to ensure a smooth transition to the ABC system. By registering on elearning platforms such as SWAYAM and other MOOC sites, our students are positioned to gain significant advantages. Many of our faculty members have also enrolled on these platforms to mentor and assist students in their academic pursuits, further enriching our educational environment. The

implementation of the ABC system at Prof. S. Nurul Hasan College represents a transformative step toward a more flexible and inclusive educational framework. By embracing blended learning, enhancing credit transfer mechanisms, and fostering collaborations, we aim to provide our students with a robust, adaptable, and comprehensive education that effectively prepares them for the future.

3. Skill development:

The National Education Policy (NEP) emphasizes the holistic development of youth, aiming to increase the Gross Enrollment Ratio and enhance skill development to support the objectives of Atmanirbhar Bharat. Key initiatives include voter registration drives and empowerment programs that educate both students and local community members about their rights and responsibilities as voters. In collaboration with the Department of Parliamentary Affairs, Government of West Bengal, the ELC organizes a Youth Parliament, enabling students to debate national and international issues while simulating parliamentary procedures. The club also celebrates National Voters Day each year with workshops, guest lectures, and interactive sessions that emphasize the importance of civic engagement. In addition to educational initiatives, the ELC encourages students to actively contribute to the electoral process by assisting with voter registration drives and supporting the district election administration during polling. The club is also involved in voter awareness campaigns that promote ethical voting practices and aim to ensure the participation of marginalized groups, including transgender individuals, commercial sex workers, persons with disabilities, and senior citizens. Recently, in collaboration with the NSS unit of Prof. S. Nurul Hasan College and the A Murshidabad Election Office, the ELC organized an awareness program for newly eligible 18+ voters, reinforcing its commitment to civic education and active participation in the democratic process.

These meetings also include interactive sessions where students can engage directly with election officials to clarify their doubts. The club sets up registration booths to guide eligible students through the registration process, promoting a deeper understanding of democratic responsibilities. Through these initiatives, the ELC aims to foster a more informed and active electorate, which is essential for sustaining the democratic fabric of society.

Prof. S. Nurul Hasan College, affiliated with the University of Kalyani, is dedicated to fostering holistic education that shapes responsible citizens equipped with advanced knowledge and strong ethical values. We emphasize meticulous academic planning, inclusivity, and continuous evaluation to support all students, particularly those from diverse backgrounds. Our faculty actively participates in curriculum development through their roles on the Board of Studies, ensuring that their insights significantly shape the curriculum framework.

The Academic Calendar, prepared by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) in collaboration with institutional authorities, aligns with university guidelines and is readily accessible on the college website. It includes key dates for the commencement of sessions, internal examinations, holidays as per the Government of West Bengal's Holiday List, and important institutional events like College Foundation Day, Annual Sports Day, and Annual Prize Day. This calendar also outlines vacations and session breaks, with deviations allowed only under special circumstances, such as during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Each semester, the Routine Committee prepares the Master Routine, incorporating departmental priorities for both undergraduate and postgraduate courses. Academic sessions begin with departmental meetings to allocate topics and develop lesson plans in accordance with the course structure. Faculty members collaborate with department heads to create detailed teaching plans, which are shared with students at the start of each semester to outline syllabus coverage. These plans and class records are meticulously maintained to ensure timely completion of the syllabus.

Recently, we have enhanced our teaching methodologies by integrating a Learning Management System (LMS), which provides digital access to teaching plans and materials. In addition to traditional instructional methods, we utilize ICT tools, audio-visual aids, and PowerPoint presentations. Regular practical classes are conducted for laboratory-based subjects, and tutorial sessions, along with specialized classes for slow learners, are organized as needed. Mentoring sessions are also available to address academic challenges faced by students.

The College Library offers a wealth of resources, including automated mail services for question papers, study materials, PowerPoint presentations, e-books, journals, magazines, theses, dissertations, and learning videos, as well as IT facilities. Continuous evaluation is an integral part of our teaching-learning process, incorporating class tests, assignment submissions, and student seminars. An Annual Test Examination precedes the university's semester exams, with results posted on departmental notice boards.

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We encourage students to participate in invited lectures, seminars, webinars, and interdisciplinary events to broaden their understanding. Wall magazines, prepared by students under faculty guidance, reflect their engagement with academic and contemporary issues. Prof. S. Nurul Hasan College is committed to integrating essential cross-cutting themes such as Professional Ethics, Gender, Human Values, Environment, and Sustainability into its curriculum in collaboration with the University of Kalyani. These themes play a vital role in shaping students' perspectives, values, and behaviors, both personally and professionally.

Professional ethics are a cornerstone of the educational framework, particularly in programs emphasizing community ethics and environmental communication. Courses in disciplines like Political Science, Sociology, and History examine ethical considerations and gender issues, while Sociology and Education focus on human values, emphasizing ethics and peace education. Environmental sustainability is woven into courses such as Geography, which covers ecology and renewable energy, and all students are required to complete a mandatory Environmental Studies course to engage with sustainability challenges.

The National Service Scheme (NSS) promote community welfare and environmental awareness through initiatives like tree planting and the distribution of essential goods, fostering civic responsibility and environmental stewardship. To address these critical issues, the college organizes a week-long Value Orientation Course at the beginning of each academic session. This course allows new students to engage with resource persons on ethical topics and participate in discussions aimed at moral upliftment.

Professional ethics are emphasized across various subjects, with the Arabic department focusing on ethics as a core aspect of its curriculum. The Physical Education department and the Yoga center host workshops and training programs on Intellectual Property Rights to promote professional integrity. Gender concerns are addressed in courses across disciplines, including Political Science, English, Bengali, and History, covering topics such as Gender Rights, Social Issues, Domestic Violence, Feminism, Ecofeminism, Women's Education, Inequality, and Women Empowerment.

The Internal Complaints Committee celebrates International Women's Day with seminars, participatory activities, and discussions featuring prominent speakers on gender-related issues. The NSS also conducts awareness programs for local communities, focusing on personal hygiene, nutrition, and health.

Human values are integrated into various disciplines, with Political Science exploring social and political communication, social changes, and challenges. Language departments engage with themes of Humanism, ethical debates surrounding euthanasia and suicide, and social and political philosophy. Human Geography examines social processes and well-being. Special lectures and NSS activities, including flood relief and donations, further promote human values.

Environmental and sustainability issues are addressed through Political Science, Geography, and Economics. The curriculum includes Environmental Studies as an AECC paper, covering pollution, hazards, Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA), and sustainable development. The college organizes seminars, online workshops, and webinars to celebrate World Environment Day and other relevant occasions, enhancing awareness of environmental issues.

Beyond the curriculum, the NSS conducts cleanliness drives, plantation initiatives, and awareness programs on water conservation and the dangers of plastic, reinforcing environmental consciousness among students. Response:

After admission, Prof. S. Nurul Hasan College conducts a 'Student Aptitude Test' to assess students' academic, social, and intellectual backgrounds. Faculty evaluate competencies through academic performance and classroom interactions. Advanced learners identified during this process access a wealth of resources, including e-journals and advanced e-books via N-LIST, and are encouraged to enroll in SWAYAM and MOOC courses. They participate in seminars, quizzes, debates, and take on teaching assistant roles in practical classes, contributing to wall magazines and engaging in poster competitions.

The library provides career guidance materials and resources for competitive exams, with faculty promoting their use among advanced learners. Regular mentoring sessions support slow learners by addressing academic challenges and developing strategies based on internal assessments. Remedial classes and supplementary materials, along with specialized sessions for competitive exams like NET, SLET, SET, and CUET, are also offered. Parent-teacher meetings are scheduled as needed to discuss academic progress and resolve concerns.

The integration of Information and Communication Technology (ICT) has significantly enhanced the teaching and learning experience. Departments organize field trips and excursions to complement the curriculum, utilizing ICT tools for information gathering and enhancing field study documentation. Post-pandemic, the college has incorporated internships and apprenticeship projects to further student

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learning.

Language learning courses are offered by the English and Bengali-Arabic departments, while the Political Science department organizes Youth Parliament Competitions using PowerPoint. Participative learning is promoted through industrial site visits, seminars, student presentations, and project work. The History Department's Museum fosters critical thinking, while clubs like the Eco Club and Unity Club support experiential learning.

Outreach programs, including tree plantation and cleanliness drives through the National Service Scheme, foster environmental awareness and social responsibility. Students have participated in certificate courses on ICT and Functional English, alongside seminars and workshops. Teachers use various ICT tools, such as PowerPoint and Learning Management Systems (LMS), for presentations and class plans. Online assessments are conducted through Continuous Internal Assessment.

To enhance faculty knowledge of advanced software, online training sessions are organized. Learning materials are accessible on the college website, and resources are shared through WhatsApp. The library features an automated, Wi-Fi-enabled system with QR-enabled web OPAC and a cloud-based Integrated Library Management System (ILMS), enriching the e-learning environment. Regular user orientation on Open Educational Resources (OERs) and digital learning technologies is conducted, transforming the library into a vibrant information center.

Student-centric methods such as experiential learning, participative learning, and problem-solving methodologies enhance learning experiences and promote deeper understanding. Experiential learning allows students to apply theoretical knowledge through hands-on activities, such as laboratory experiments. Participative learning encourages collaboration among students, fostering critical thinking through group discussions and peer teaching. Problem-solving methodologies present real-world challenges, encouraging creative and analytical thinking.

For practical subjects, 30% of the marks are allocated to practical exams.

Support for Students

- Departments maintain monthly attendance records, reaching out to students with low attendance to provide guidance.
- Regular class tests and remedial classes monitor and support student progress.
- During the COVID-19 pandemic, assessments were adapted to online formats to ensure timely evaluations.

Quality Assurance

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) collaborates with stakeholders to enhance assessment methods, implementing project-based evaluations, group discussions, and seminar presentations. The Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) system allows flexibility for departments in scheduling tests and selecting evaluation methods.

The college adheres strictly to University of Kalyani regulations for external examinations, ensuring timely enrollment, issuance of admit cards, and compliance with the university timetable. Mark sheets

are issued promptly after evaluations, and grievances related to external exams are addressed through the Post Publication Review (PPR) and Post Publication Scrutiny (PPS) processes.

The attainment level score for each course is calculated by combining 80% from direct methods and 20% from indirect methods, ensuring a comprehensive evaluation.

In contrast, ICT allows teaching content to be reused, supporting students who may need extra help without additional faculty time. Econtent can be shared with students who miss classes, ensuring that all learners benefit.

Practices:

Prof. S Nurul Hasan College has developed four smart digital classrooms, one virtual classroom, and a conference room equipped with portable projectors and screens. Within these ICT-based rooms, three techniques are utilized:

- 1. **Prepared Presentations:** Teachers create slides in advance and deliver lectures using PowerPoint along with relevant video clips through an LCD projector.
- 2. **Interactive Boards:** Lessons are taught using interactive boards instead of traditional methods. The content delivered through these boards is converted into PDF files, which can be easily shared via email and social media.
- 3. **Online Interaction:** Students outside the classroom can interact with teachers during lectures, enhancing learning through real-time communication.

Regular classes are integrated into the daily routine, and a training program on ICT use in the classroom was organized under the IQAC's supervision last year.
